

Recreational Fires

No Permit required includes Burn Barrel & Receptacle

Conditions:

- 5m (16') from property lines, building, tree, hedge, fence, roadway, deck, overhead wire or any other combustible materials.
- Maximum size is 1 sq. meter (3.25'x3.25')
- Fuel contained within non combustible container or fire pit to prevent the spread of fire.
- No material other than commercially produced fire logs, charcoal, briquettes, wood chips or clean, dry seasoned wood may be burned.
- Supervised by competent person.
- Adequate means to extinguish fire on site.

Burn Barrel & Receptacle

Conditions:

- One Barrel or Receptacle at a time.
- Between sunrise and sunset.
- No burning in the settlement* area.
- Only brush, leaves or grass cuttings.
- Minimum 50m (164') from nearest dwelling.
- 5m (16') from property line, any structure, building, tree, hedge, fence, roadway, deck, etc...



Open Air Fires less than 2 cubic metres

Permit required

Conditions:

- Between sunrise and sunset.
- No burning in the settlement* area.
- Maximum size is 2 sq. meter (6.5''X6.5'X6.5')
- 50m (164') from nearest dwelling.
- 5m (16') from property line.
- 15m (49') from forest, woodland or building.
- No more than 3 piles and minimum of 5m (16') between each. Only clean dry brush.
- Supervised at all times by competent person.
- Adequate means to extinguish fire on site.
- Permit on site and available.

Open Air Fires greater than 2 cubic metres

Permit required (farming and land clearing operations)

Conditions:

- Between sunrise and sunset.
- Pile not exceed 10 m (33') in diameters and height.
- No more than 3 piles and 9 m (30') between piles.
- 75m (246') from building, structures, standing timber or other flammable or combustible materials.
- 200m (656') adjacent to any residence not owned by permit holder.
- Supervised at all times by competent person.
- Mechanical equipment to control and/or extinguish the fire must be on site.
- Must be extinguished at end of each day.
- Permit on site and available.
