THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH STORMONT BY-LAW NO. 64-2021

BEING a By-Law to regulate the consumption of water from municipal waterworks.

WHEREAS Sections 8, 9 and 10 of the Municipal Act, 2001, authorize a municipality to pass by-laws that are necessary or desirable for municipal purposes and, in particular, respecting economic, social and environmental well-being of the municipality; health, well-being and safety of Persons; services and things that the municipality is authorized to provide; and protection of Persons and property, including consumer protection;

WHEREAS the Corporation of the Township of North Stormont deems it desirable to regulate water consumption during the summer months to protect the supply of water in the municipal waterworks.

NOW THEREFORE Council of the Township of the North Stormont hereby enacts as follows:

SHORT TITLE

1. This by-law may be cited as the "Water Usage By-law"

DEFINITIONS

- 2. In this by-law:
 - a. "Corporation" shall mean the Corporation of the Township of North Stormont;
 - b. "Council" shall mean the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Stormont;
 - c. "Water & Sewer Operator" shall mean the Ontario Clean Water Agency as contractor for operations of the municipal water and sewer system;
 - d. "Municipal Clerk" shall mean the Municipal Clerk of the Corporation of the Township of North Stormont.
 - e. "Municipal Law Enforcement Officer" shall mean a Municipal Enforcement Officer appointed by the Council of the Township of North Stormont;
 - f. "Township" shall mean the Township of North Stormont;
 - g. "Fire Hydrant" shall mean an upright pipe with a nozzle or spout for drawing water from a water main;

GENERAL

- 3. No person shall use, or cause to be used, water from any municipal waterworks at any time between May 1st and September 30th of any year for the purpose of watering lawns, gardens, flowers, hedges, or any other vegetation outside any building except as hereinafter provided:
 - a. Persons located at even numbered buildings shall be permitted to water lawns, gardens, flowers, hedges or any other vegetation outside on Monday, Wednesday and Friday between 7 p.m. and 10 p.m., and persons located at odd numbered buildings shall be permitted to water lawns, gardens, flowers, hedges or any other vegetation outside on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday between 7 p.m. and 10 p.m.. No outside watering will be permitted on Sundays.
 - b. Persons watering manually shall be permitted to water lawns, gardens, flowers, hedges or any other vegetation outside any building;
 - c. A contractor that needs to take water from a fire hydrant in order to perform work in the Township must contact the water operator in charge.
 - d. The operator in Charge can allow usage of specific fire hydrant or refuse water taking.
 - e. Backflow Prevention Assembly shall be required. Otherwise an air gap shall be maintained at all times.
 - f. The cost for the connection shall be \$75.00 except for work done for the Township.
 - g. The taking of water for fire hydrant shall be from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday to Friday.
 - h. The hydrant shall be opened with a hydrant wrench to prevent damage, and the valve must be fully open. Hydrant damage will be charged to contractor operating the hydrant. It is a violation when equipment in disrepair causes water waste.
 - i. Fire Hydrant shall not be operated to take water during winter, other than for the Fire Department.

GRANT OF EXEMPTION TO THIS BY-LAW

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in this By-Law,

- a. Newly installed sod: a person may send a written request for exemption of this by-law to the Municipal Clerk. If approved, newly installed sod may be exempt to the water restriction by allowing watering of sod between 7:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. for the period of 7 days.
- b. Any other request for exemption of this by-law can be sent to the Municipal Clerk in writing.

DECLERATION OF TOTAL BAN ON WATERING

5. In the event of emergency conditions, the Mayor, Chief Administrative Officer and Water and Sewer Operator, the Township may suspend any exemption as set out in section 3 and 4 of this By-Law and notice of the declaration of emergency conditions shall be sent to all affected residents by bulk mail.

ADMINISTRATION

6. The Provisions of this By-Law shall be enforced by the Municipal Law Enforcement Officer.

PENALTIES

- 7. Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law is guilty of an offence and on conviction thereof shall forfeit and pay a penalty for each such offence and every such penalty shall be recoverable under the *Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O.* 1990, c. P.33 and amendment thereto.
- 7.1 Every person is guilty of an offence who,
 - a. willfully hinders or interrupts, or causes or procures to be hindered or interrupted the corporation, or any of its officers, contractors, agents, servants or workers, in the exercise of any of the powers conferred by the Public Utilities Act;
 - b. willfully lets off or discharges water so that the water runs waste or useless out of the works;
 - c. being a tenant, occupant, or inmate of any house, building or other place supplied with water from the waterworks, improperly wastes the water or, without the consent of the corporation, lends, sells, or disposes of the water, gives it away, permits it to be taken or carried away, uses or applies it to the use or benefit of another, or to any use and benefit other than the person's own or increases the supply of water agreed for;

- d. without lawful authority willfully opens or closes any hydrant, or obstructs the free access to any hydrant, stopcock, chamber, pipe, or hydrant-chamber, by placing on it any building material, rubbish or any other obstruction;
- e. throws or deposits any injurious, noisome or offensive matter into the water or waterworks, or upon the ice, if the water is frozen, or in any ways fouls the water or commits any willful damage, or injury to the works, pipes or water, or encourages the same to be done;
- f. willfully alters any meter placed upon any service pipe or connected therewith, within or without any building or other place, so as to lessen or alter the amount of water registered; or
- g. lays or causes to be laid any pipe or main to communicate with any pipe or main of the waterworks, or in any way obtains or uses the water without the consent of the corporation, is guilty of an offence.
- 8. Any person involved in the unauthorized use of hydrant water will be charged for: the water taken, the costs incurred to investigate and correct the use, penalty fees, and other remedies authorized by law.

 Hydrant use violation set fines are \$300.00
- 9. When a person has been convicted of an offence under this By-Law, any court of competent jurisdiction thereafter, may, in addition to any other penalty imposed on the person convicted, issue an order prohibiting the continuation or repetition of the offence or the doing of any act or thing by the person convicted directed towards the continuation or repetition of the offence.
- 10. The requirements of this By-Law are severable, if any requirements of this By-Law are held invalid, the application of such requirements to other circumstances and the remainder of this by-law shall not be affected.
- 11. **THAT** this By-Law shall come into force on the date of its adoption and shall effect on that date.

3.0 BACKGROUND

The landowners from the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of the W $\frac{1}{2}$ of Lot 19, Concession 10 to the West Part of Lot 22, Concession 10 have requested that the upstream portion of the Jean Paul Sabourin Municipal drain be abandoned across their properties, from station 39+01 to 0+00, and the extension from station 0+00 to 14+87. The landowners would like to enclose the watercourse to allow for more efficient farming practices including the use of a new buried tile drain as opposed to the existing open ditch.

The lower portion of the drain is to remain municipal and will continue to be maintained by the Township of North Stormont

4.0 POLICY CONSIDERATION

5.0 ANALYSIS

Section 84 (1) of The Drainage Act specifies the procedures to be followed for abandonment of a drainage works.

Under Section 84 (1) the general procedure to be followed is:

- Upon written request of three-quarters of the owners of land assessed for benefit in respect of a drainage works, council shall forthwith notify all owners of land assessed for the drainage works by prepaid mail of its intention to abandon such works.
- All notified owners are then given the opportunity to request the report of an engineer to be made on such proposed abandonment.
- If, within ten days any objecting owner notifies the clerk, the council shall appoint an engineer to examine the drainage works and report recommendations as to the proposed abandonment.
- If no notice of objection is mailed to the clerk as above, the council may by by-law abandon the drainage works, and thereafter the municipality has no further obligation with respect to the drainage works.

The notices of abandonment were mailed out; no objections or request for the report of an Engineer have been received.

6.0 **ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS**

The landowner has been informed that any change to the drainage works must be in compliance with the permit(s) and environmental approvals, including but not limited to a permit(s) from the South Nation Conservation Authority and the Department of Fisheries and Oceans. This appointment was completed to support the Chief Building Official, Mr. Brisson, during vacation and other absences. Mr. Rheaume would complete required building inspections, within Township boundaries, in Mr. Brisson brief absences to ensure our developers could continue works uninterupted.

Future, extended absences, by Mr. Brisson, would result in a cessation of

permit reviews and approvals. Mr. Rheaume's enhanced status would provide the ability to review, and approve, permits on an as needed basis and at the discretion/direction of Mr. Brisson (CBO).

Mr. Jacob Rheaume possesses the mandatory training that qualifies him to hold such a position and execute these responsibilities on behalf of the Township. Mr. Rheaume will continue to conduct inspections, in the absence of Mr. Brisson, pertaining to construction activities. Mr. Rheaume will also have the capability, if needed, to conduct/complete plan review and provide assistance to building inquiries if applications are submitted in the absence of Mr. Brisson. This appointment would also provide for personal permit review, approval and issuance for Mr. Brisson, should such permits be required for his personal use in the future. Mr. Rheaume's expanded duties would allow for an objective and impartial review of any future/potential building permit applications that may be received from Mr. Brisson in the future.

That council approves the proposal to reconstruct the the Eighth Road in Moose Creek from Valley Street to the Via Rail crossing.

2.0 **LEGAL DESCRIPTION**

3.0 BACKGROUND

The Eighth Road is surfaced with asphalt that was laid in 1993. With the increased truck traffic and the deterioration of this road surface, Public works is proposing to have this road reconstructed. This road is beyond the state of repair, Public Works has overlaid this road with temporary gravel patches where required due to safety reasons with the road surface.

This road is currently 6.1m wide and will be reconstructed to 7.5m wide. The road will be reconstructed with a new granular base and 50mm of HL3 for the finished surface.

4.0 POLICY CONSIDERATION

5.0 ANALYSIS

The Eighth Road from Valley Street to the Via Rail tracks (including the intersection at valley) is 1km long. Public Works will pulverize the road and build the intersection up at valley to decrease in incline approaching the yield sign.

The road would take approximately \$50,000 of gravel which Public Works will apply and finish grade for asphalt. Approximately 1100 ton of asphalt will be needed to complete 50mm of HL3 asphalt, based on previous quotes the

asphalt could be quoted anywhere from \$80-\$90 a ton laid(including the driveway tie-ins)

Please note this project would qualify for the gas tax funding which is double this year.

6.0 **ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS**

7.0 RECOMMENDED CONDITIONS

That council approves the proposal to reconstruct the Eighth Road for an approximate amount of \$140,000.00 that is not in the current budget.

8.0 **ALTERNATIVES**

That council refuses this proposal and Public Works would have to pulverize the road, leave it gravel for the remainder of the year and bring it to council for 2022 for a new surface.

Fee Proposal

R.V. Anderson Associates Limited (RVA) is pleased to provide this proposal for engineering services to The Township of North Stormont for an update to the 2014 Water and Sewer Reserve Study for the Villages of Crysler, Finch, and Moose Creek. This proposal is based on the email request of May 25, 2021. The total cost of this services is \$5,200.00, which includes standard disbursements but does not include HST.

PROJECT BACKGROUND AND OBJECTIVES

The objective of the assignment is to update calculations on the remaining reserve capacity for water and sewer in the three referenced villages, given existing and planned development as per the MECP guidelines for uncommitted reserve capacity. The information is typically used to allocate and track capacity available for new development and infill for planning purposes.

Moose Creek has a water treatment and supply system with a rated capacity of 10.4 L/s (896 m³/d), and a sewage collection and treatment system consisting of a sewage pumping station and lagoon.

Finch's water treatment system is capable of delivering 9.0 L/s, and Crysler's water treatment system is capable of delivering 19.5 L/s. Finch and Crysler share a sewage collection and treatment system, consisting of multiple sewage pumping stations and a shared lagoon.

SCOPE OF WORK

To achieve the objective set out above, our scope of work for the project will include the following:

- Meet with Township and operations staff to discuss updated subdivision/lot information and receive all available data;
- Update water and sewer capacity and flow calculations;
- Prepare updated reserve capacity calculations as per MECP/MMAH requirements;
- Prepare a brief memo summarizing the reserve capacity in lots for the three villages;
- Workshop/Meeting to discuss results and address any questions.

Re: Notification of Flow Rate Exceedance - Finch DWS - PTTW #8762-BM6TA5

This letter provides written notification of non-compliance with respect to the maximum allowable flow rate specified under Condition 3.2 of PTTW #8762-BM6TA5 issued for the village of Finch's municipal wells located at 20 William Street, in the Township of North Stormont. This letter confirms the verbal notification of non-compliance provided by OCWA to the Ontario Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Park's Spills Action Centre on May 11, 2021 (Reference # 5521-C2HJT3).

The maximum flow rate for Well #1 was exceeded for short durations between February 9, 2021 and April 26, 2021 as demonstrated in the tables attached. A summary of the exceedances for each month is shown below:

In December 2020 a backup submersible well pump sized for the flow rate specified in previously issued Permits to Take Water for Finch's municipal wells was installed in Well #1. The flow control valve was throttled to accommodate the lowered maximum allowable rate of taking specified for the well in the renewed PTTW issued on February 26, 2020. The flow rate exceedances being reported here occurred on well pump start up with spikes of short duration exceeding the maximum flow rate of 7.98 L/s (479 L/min) identified for Well #1 in the 2020 Permit. OCWA had been in contact with the MECP upon receipt of the renewed Permit in 2020 in attempt to have the flow rates revised to reflect the former flow rates specified for the wells since there were no grounds for changes being made to the flow rates for either well (decreased to 479 L/min for Well #1 and increased to 599 L/min for Well #2) during the PTTW renewal. After several follow up attempts with MECP, a revised PTTW with the original 9 L/s (540 L/min) maximum rates of taking for both wells was finally issued on April 28, 2021 (PTTW #8713-C2HJT3).

This letter provides written notification of non-compliance with the effluent concentration limit for suspended solids outlined in Condition 12(2) of Certificate of Approval No. 3-1555-91-936. This letter confirms the verbal notification of non-compliance provided by OCWA to the Ontario Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Park's Spills Action Centre on May 11, 2021 (Reference # 8218-C2WJYA).

The following effluent parameter was exceeded:

The spring discharge of Moose Creek's sewage lagoon began on April 21, 2021 and ended on April 30, 2021. Four samples were collected during the discharge. The major contributing factor for elevated suspended solids in the effluent samples was algae growth in the lagoon cells.

All other effluent parameters remained below the C of A limits throughout the discharge. A complete listing of all sample results obtained during the spring discharge can be found in the Lagoon Discharge PAR, attached.

System Process Description

Raw Source

Crysler's drinking water system draws water from a groundwater production well (Well #1) located approximately 5 kilometers east of the Village. There is also a standby well (Well #2) located on site. Well #1 is a 250 mm diameter 12.2 m deep drilled well equipped with a submersible turbine pump rated at 19.5 L/s. The standby well is a 250 mm diameter 13.4 m deep drilled well equipped with a submersible turbine pump rated at 19.5 L/s. Crysler's well supply is considered groundwater under the direct influence of surface water (GUDI) with effective in situ filtration.

Treatment

Raw water enters the pump house and passes through one of two ultra violet (UV) light reactors which provide primary disinfection of the water. UV intensity is monitored continuously. Sodium hypochlorite is then injected to provide secondary disinfection. Contact time is achieved in the transmission pipe. Treated water leaving the plant is continuously monitored for flow, chlorine residual and turbidity.

Distribution

The water system began supplying water to the Village in 1996. The distribution system consists of an elevated storage tank and approximately 11 kilometers of PVC distribution piping. The elevated tank is

fabricated of steel and mounted on a concrete pedestal. It is located on the north side of County Road 13 approximately 600 m east of Crysler and has a storage capacity of 1238 m³. The storage tank provides for peak hour demands and fire flows.

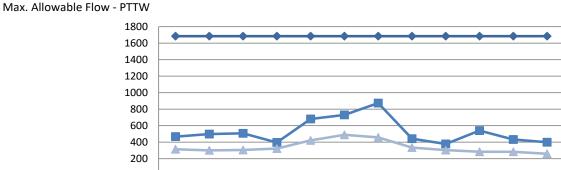

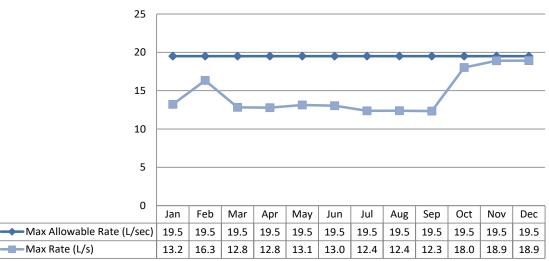

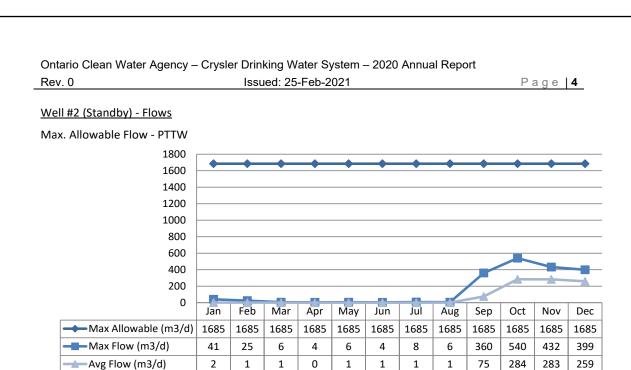

Well #1 - Maximum Flow Rates

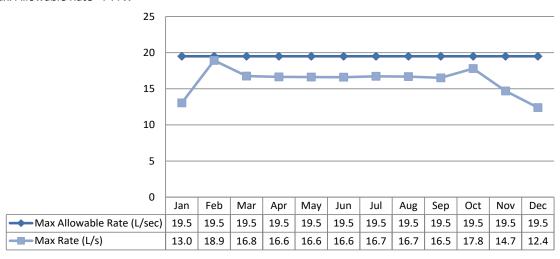

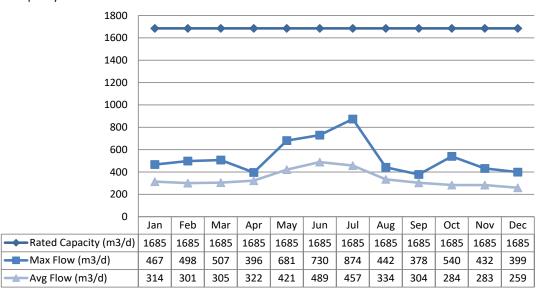

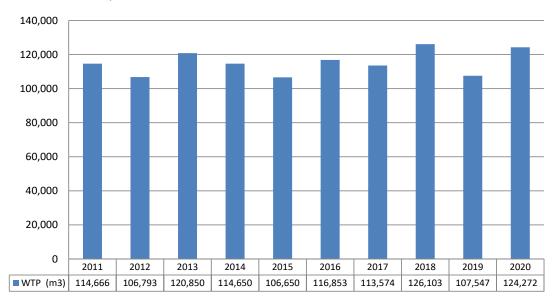

System Process Description

Crysler's wastewater system consists of a gravity fed sanitary sewage collection system, one pumping station and a wastewater treatment lagoon. The system also receives municipal wastewater from the Village of Finch. Finch has three small sewage pumping stations and one main pumping station (SPS #1) where ferric chloride is injected before the wastewater is pumped to Crysler. The sewage from Finch takes up about 45% of Crysler's sewer and pump station capacity. Upgrades to Crysler's SPS were completed in 2014 to increase the pumping capacity of the station from 35 l/s to 46 l/s.

The combined sewage from Crysler and Finch is pumped over a distance of 2.7 kilometers from Crysler's SPS to the sewage lagoon located on the north bank of the South Nation River. A chemical injection building is located on site housing a 20,000 litre alum storage tank and two chemical feed pumps (one duty and one standby). Aluminum sulphate is injected for phosphorus control as wastewater is pumped to the lagoon. The total capacity of the lagoon system is 297,600 m³. The west facultative cell (Cell #1) has an operating volume of 61,700 m³, and the east facultative cell (Cell #2) has an operating volume of 87,900 m³. The center cell (Cell #3) is equipped with aeration and has an operating volume of 148,000 m³. Effluent is discharged from the center cell through a 675 mm outfall to the South Nation River.

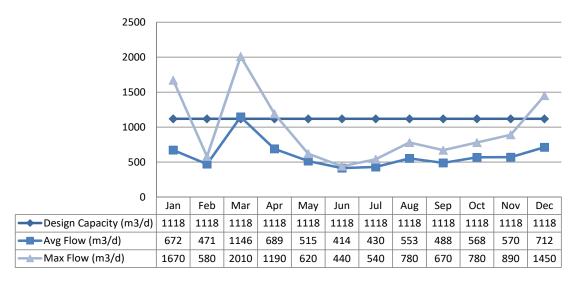
The lagoon can be operated on a semi-annual discharge basis in accordance with the ECA which allows effluent to be discharged in the spring and in the fall. Currently, only the spring discharge window is utilized.

Wastewater System Flows

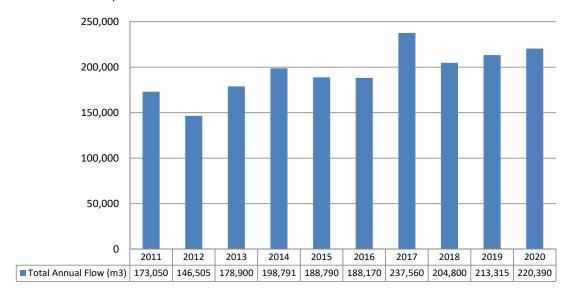

Effluent Flow

A total of 286,667 m³ was discharged from Crysler's sewage lagoons in the spring of 2020.

Effluent Quality Assurance or Control Measures

Effluent control measures include pre-discharge sampling and testing of lagoon cell contents prior to discharge. The samples are collected by the Ontario Clean Water Agency's competent and licensed staff using approved methods and protocols for sampling including those specified in the Ministry's Procedure F-10-1, "Procedures for Sampling and Analysis Requirements for Municipal and Private Sewage Treatment Works", the Ministry's publication, "Protocol for the Sampling and Analysis of Industrial/Municipal Wastewater" and the publication, "Standard Methods for the Examination of Water and Wastewater".

All effluent samples collected during the reporting period were submitted to Caduceon in Ottawa for analysis, with the exception of pH and temperature. Caduceon is accredited by the Canadian Association for Laboratory Accreditation (CALA). Accredited labs must meet strict provincial guidelines including an extensive quality assurance/quality control program. By choosing this laboratory, OCWA is ensuring appropriate control measures are undertaken during sample analysis.

The pH and temperature were analyzed in the field at the time of sample collection by certified operators to ensure accuracy and precision of the results obtained.

This written notice confirms the verbal notification provided by OCWA on December 29th, 2020 to the Ontario Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks' Spills Action Centre (Reference #4273-BWRM42).

Details:

On December 29th, 2020 at 9:09 AM OCWA received a page from Falcon Security indicating a leak in the berm of Cell #1 at the Crysler Sewage Lagoon (Works # 110002960) that had entered a receiving ditch. The estimated volume below is the worst case scenario as the actual start date is unknown, OCWA last checked the lagoon on December 23rd and no leak was found.

System Process Description

Raw Source

Finch's drinking water system draws water from two groundwater production wells completed in bedrock (Well #1 and Well #2). Well #1 is a 200 mm diameter 54 m deep drilled well located inside the treatment building equipped with a submersible well pump rated at 5 L/s at 50 m total dynamic head (TDH). Well #2 is a 200 mm diameter 54 m deep drilled well located inside the treatment building equipped with a submersible well pump rated at 9.5 L/s at 44.5 m total dynamic head (TDH).

Treatment

The treatment plant is designed for 777.6 m^3 per day. Contact time is provided in the plant piping, clear well and filters. The treatment facility houses a forced draft aeration tower with capacity of 8 L/s equipped with plastic packing. Sodium hypochlorite is used for primary and secondary disinfection. Sodium hypochlorite is injected by one of two chemical feed pumps prior to entry into the clear well. The clear well is constructed of reinforced concrete and has a minimum operating volume of 20.5 m^3 . Two high lift pumps, each with a capacity of 5 L/s at a TDH of 60 m, deliver water from the clear well to two dual media pressure filters and then to the distribution system. Operation of the high lift pumps is controlled by the water level in the elevated storage tank. The dual media pressure filters are operated in parallel. Each filter has a flow rate of 4 L/s at a filtration rate of approximately 9 m/h. The treatment plant also houses a 1.5 m diameter baffled pressure vessel for flocculation (presently unused) with a

volume of approximately $4 \, \text{m}^3$. The pressure vessel provides a detention time of 8 minutes at a design flow of 8 L/s. Backwash wastewater is collected in a surge tank of approximately 15 m³ capacity. The wastewater is pumped directly from the surge tank to the sanitary sewer. Water leaving the treatment plant is continuously monitored for flow, chlorine residual and turbidity.

Distribution

The distribution system consists of an elevated storage tank and approximately 9 km of PVC distribution piping installed in the 1970's. The elevated tank is located across the street from the water treatment plant and has a storage capacity of 580 m³. It provides for peak hour demands and fire flows.

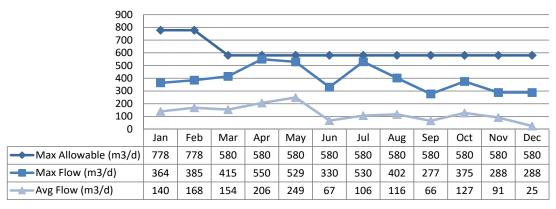

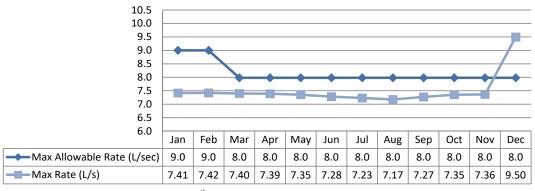

Well #1 - Maximum Flow Rates



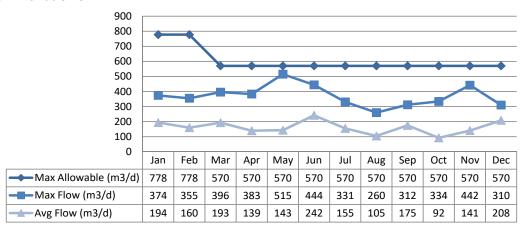

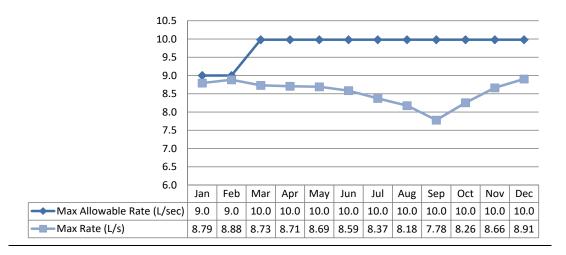

Well #2 - Maximum Flow Rates

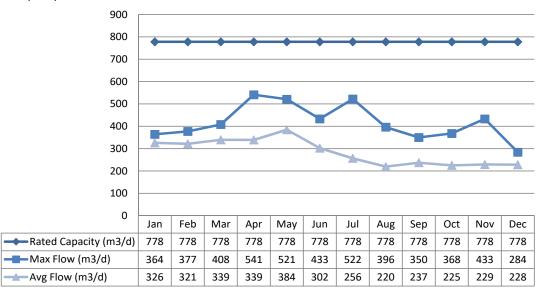

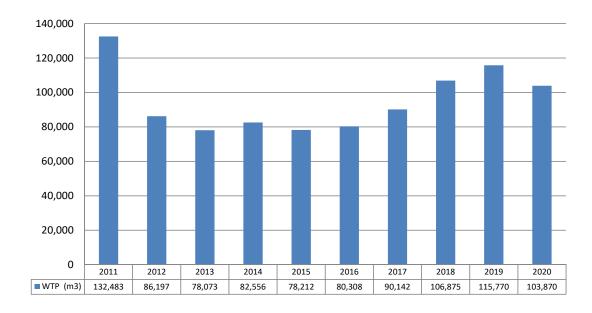

System Process Description

Raw Source

Moose Creek's drinking water system draws water from three wells completed in overburden sediments. Well #1R is a 200 mm diameter 15.2 m deep drilled groundwater production well equipped with a submersible well pump rated at 7.43 L/s at 14.3 m total dynamic head (TDH). Well #2 is a 200 mm diameter 30.8 m deep drilled groundwater production well equipped with a submersible well pump rated at 3.5 L/s at 40 m total dynamic head (TDH). Well #3 is a 200 mm diameter 32 m deep drilled groundwater production well equipped with a submersible well pump rated at 3.5 L/s at 42 m total dynamic head (TDH). Water from the three wells is conveyed in separate 50 mm diameter pipes to the pump house for treatment.

Treatment

Sodium hypochlorite is used for both primary and secondary disinfection. It is injected prior to discharge into a mixing chamber. After passing through the mixing chamber, the chlorinated water enters two clearwells. Two high lift pumps, each rated at 10.4 L/s at 58 m TDH, convey water from the clearwells to the distribution system. Water leaving the treatment plant is continuously monitored for flow and free chlorine residual.

Distribution

The distribution system consists of an elevated tank and approximately 7 km of PVC distribution piping installed in 1993 and 1994. The elevated storage tank is fabricated of steel and mounted on a concrete pedestal. It is located along County Road 15, west of the Village of Moose Creek and has a storage capacity of 622 m³. The storage tank provides for peak hour demands and fire flows.

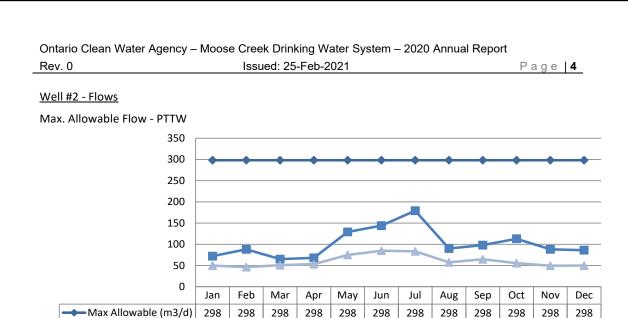
Well #1 - Flows





Well #1 - Maximum Flow Rates

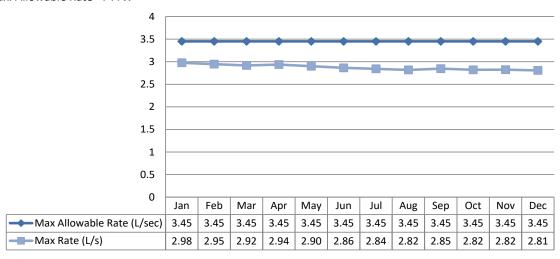


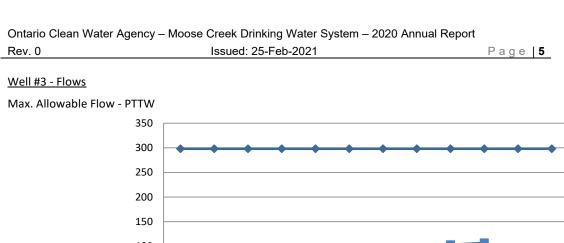


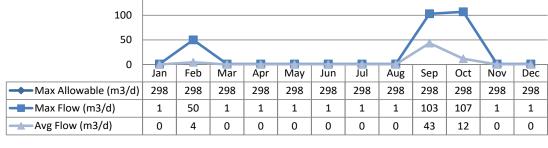
Well #2 - Maximum Flow Rates

Max Flow (m3/d)

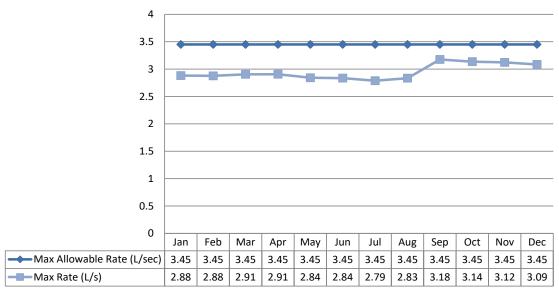

Well #3 - Maximum Flow Rates



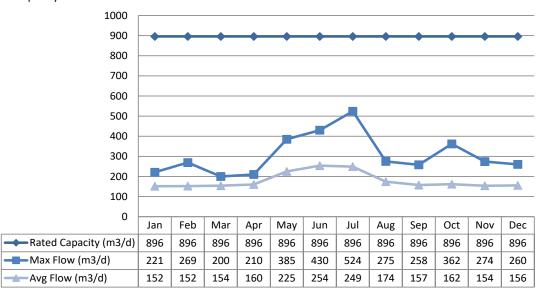

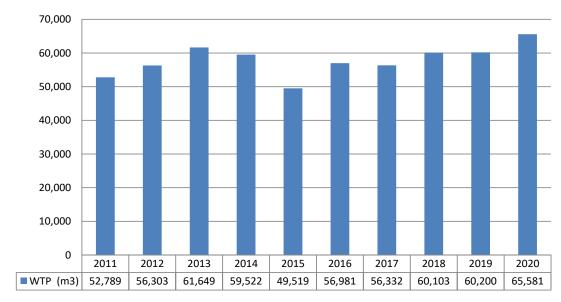

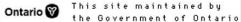

System Process Description

Moose Creek's wastewater system began operation in 1995. It consists of a gravity fed sanitary sewage collection system, one pumping station and a wastewater treatment lagoon. The pumping station is located on Simeon Lane in Moose Creek and pumps wastewater from the collection system to the lagoon.

Moose Creek's sewage lagoon system consists of two facultative cells of equal size equipped with mechanical aeration. The cells are constructed with a high density polyethylene geomembrane liner and an underdrain system with an associated groundwater pumping station to prevent uplift of the liner. The total capacity of the lagoon system is 110,376 m³. A chemical injection building is located on site housing a 10,000 litre storage tank and two chemical feed pumps (one duty and one standby). Aluminum sulphate is injected for phosphorus control as wastewater is pumped to the lagoons.

The lagoon operates on an annual discharge basis in accordance with the Certificate of Approval. Effluent is discharged through a 400 mm outfall to the Moose Creek Drain.

Groundwater Monitoring Program

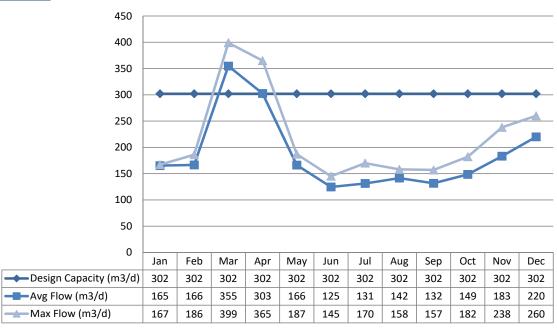
A groundwater monitoring/liner integrity program was initiated in 1995 as required under Condition 16 of the facility's Certificate of Approval. The initial findings indicated that groundwater at the lagoon site was characterized by nitrate and bacteriological contamination, likely associated with the historical agricultural use of the property. Appendix B contains the results of the 2020 Groundwater Monitoring Program carried out in accordance with the protocol set out in Golder Associates' report dated April 16, 2002. The report sets the lagoon liner leak trigger mechanism at >0.33 mg/L nitrite or >3.36 mg/L nitrate at the underdrain. Spring and fall underdrain nitrite levels were both <0.10 mg/L while the nitrate levels were 0.60 mg/L and <0.10 mg/L, respectively. Groundwater sample results have remained fairly consistent over the duration of the program. The overall consistency of the data indictes that the lagoons have not adversely affected the quality of the groundwater.

The charts in Appendix B illustrate historical spring and fall groundwater elevations in the lagoon's monitoring wells since 2002. The monitoring wells are arranged on the charts based on groundwater flow direction. The data indicates that the difference in elevation as the groundwater flows down gradient has remained relatively consistent over the duration of the monitoring program. It is expected that if groundwater mounding occurred at the site, the difference in elevation as the water flowed down gradient would begin to diminish. OCWA will continue to utilize the existing groundwater monitoring program in 2021.

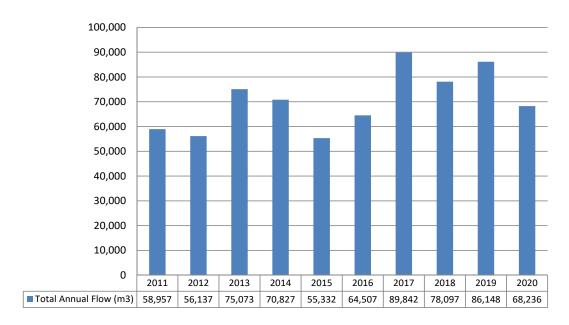
Wastewater System Flows

The hydraulic flows reaching the sewage lagoons in 2020 averaged 186 m³/day which represents 62% of the 302 m³/day design capacity.

Effluent Flow

An estimated total of 110,981 m³ was discharged from Moose Creek's sewage lagoons in the spring of 2020, although an issue with the newly installed effluent flowmeter at the lagoon caused errors in the volume readings recorded. Please see the 'Operating Issues' section of this report for details.

Effluent Quality Assurance or Control Measures

Effluent control measures include pre-discharge sampling and testing of lagoon cell contents prior to discharge. The samples are collected by the Ontario Clean Water Agency's competent and licensed staff using approved methods and protocols for sampling including those specified in the Ministry's Procedure F-10-1, "Procedures for Sampling and Analysis Requirements for Municipal and Private Sewage Treatment Works", the Ministry's publication, "Protocol for the Sampling and Analysis of Industrial/Municipal Wastewater" and the publication, "Standard Methods for the Examination of Water and Wastewater".

Based on the total phosphorus results from cell contents sampling prior to discharge, this lagoon system may be batched dosed with aluminum sulphate for phosphorus control.

All effluent samples collected during the reporting period were submitted to Caduceon laboratories in Ottawa for analysis, with the exception of pH and temperature. Caduceon is accredited by the Canadian Association for Laboratory Accreditation (CALA). Accredited labs must meet strict provincial guidelines including an extensive quality assurance/quality control program. By choosing these laboratories, OCWA is ensuring appropriate control measures are undertaken during sample analysis.

The pH and temperature were analyzed in the field at the time of sample collection by certified operators to ensure accuracy and precision of the results obtained.

Effluent Quality

The seasonal average concentrations of carbonaceous biochemical oxygen demand 5-day (CBOD₅), total phosphorus (TP), and total ammonia nitrogen (TAN) remained below the objectives and limits outlined in the Certificate of Approval during the 2020 discharge. Correspondingly, none of the seasonal waste loadings were exceeded.

Although the limit was not exceeded, the average concentration of total suspended solids (TSS) exceeded the objective of 20 mg/L during the 2020 lagoon discharge period. Please refer to the 'Operating Issues' section of this report for details.

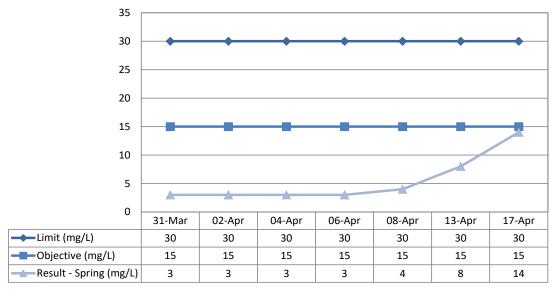
The objective of non-detectable was exceeded for undissociated hydrogen suphide (H₂S) during the lagoon discharge, although the measured concentrations remained quite low.

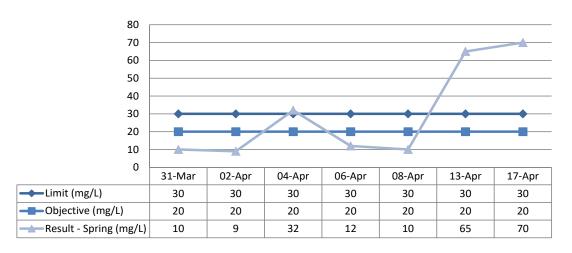

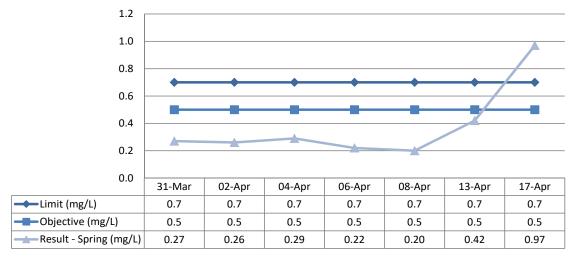
Effluent TSS Results:

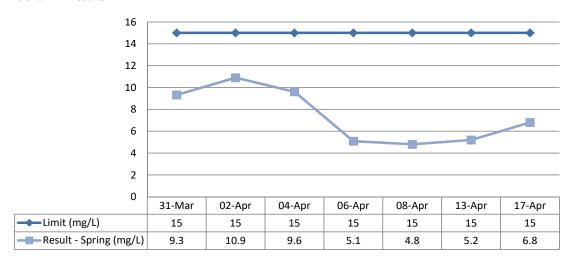

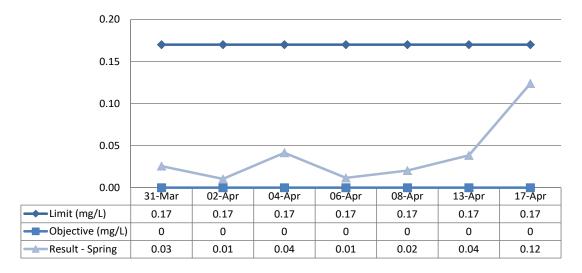

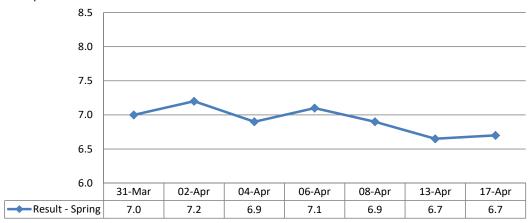

Operating Issues

The seasonal average objective for TSS was exceeded during the spring discharge in 2020. The TSS concentration in effluent from the lagoon system has been a challenge in the past due to algae growth.

An issue with the newly installed effluent flow meter at Moose Creek's sewage lagoon caused inaccurate values to be recorded for effluent flow during the 2020 spring discharge. OCWA has since had Capital Controls on site to investigate the cause of the issue and corrective actions are being implemented. Because the total flow recorded exceeded the lagoon capacity by approximately 30%, a factor was applied to the daily flow data logged by the flowmeter to bring the total value discharged down to the maximum volume the lagoon cells can hold. As such, the flows presented likely still exceed what was discharged, but provides a worst case scenario for flow during the discharge period.

- 2. **THAT** the actual assessable cost of \$984.57 for maintenance of the Upper Moose Creek Municipal Drain be assessed to the upstream lands and roads in the Township of North Stormont in proportions determined by By-Law 503 (original report), all as described in the Schedule of Assessments attached to and forming part of this By-Law as Schedule "A";
- 3. **THAT** each owner assessed \$500.00 or more will be invoiced and be given until September 30th, 2021 to pay the net cost as outlined in column of the Schedule of Assessments entitled "Net Maintenance Cost" and all assessments of \$499.99 or less will be added to the 2021 municipal taxes in one installment. Accounts of \$500.00 or more not paid by the due date shall be added to the 2022 municipal taxes with principal and interest at the rate of 1.25% per month.

- 3. **THAT** each owner assessed \$500.00 or more will be invoiced and be given until September 30th, 2021 to pay the net cost as outlined in column of the Schedule of Assessments entitled "Net Maintenance Cost" and all assessments of \$499.99 or less will be added to the 2021 municipal taxes in one installment. Accounts of \$500.00 or more not paid by the due date shall be added to the 2022 municipal taxes with principal and interest at the rate of 1.25% per month.

AND WHEREAS the Municipal Act, 2001, c. 25 s. 5 (3) provides that the powers of every council are to be exercised by by-law;

REFERENCE: Section 74 of the *Drainage Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. D.17

AND WHEREAS a request was received from certain property owners along the drain, that maintenance and repairs be made on the Monkland Municipal Drain.

AND WHEREAS the actual cost of the maintenance was \$1,179.15 with no applicable grant portion;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the Township of North Stormont hereby enacts as follows:

- THAT MacDonald Technical Services Inc., Drainage Superintendent was ordered to proceed with the maintenance of the Monkland Municipal Drain, according to the existing plan and profile of said drain.
- 2. **THAT** Council authorize write off of \$188.78 and the actual assessable cost of \$990.37 for maintenance of the Monkland Municipal Drain be assessed to the upstream lands and roads in the Township of North Stormont in proportions determined by By-Law# 253 (original report), all as described in the Schedule of Assessments attached to and forming part of this By-Law as Schedule "A";
- 3. **THAT** each owner assessed \$500.00 or more will be invoiced and be given until September 30th, 2021 to pay the net cost as outlined in column of the Schedule of Assessments entitled "Net Maintenance Cost" and all assessments of \$499.99 or less will be added to the 2021 municipal taxes in one installment. Accounts of \$500.00 or more not paid by the due date shall be added to the 2022 municipal taxes with principal and interest at the rate of 1.25% per month.

BY-LAW NO. 58-2021

- THAT MacDonald Technical Services Inc., Drainage Superintendent was ordered to proceed with the maintenance of the Duncan Campbell Municipal Drain, according to the existing plan and profile of said drain.
- 2. **THAT** Council authorize write off of \$58.70 and the actual assessable cost of \$654.44 for maintenance of the Duncan Campbell Municipal Drain be assessed to the upstream lands and roads in the Township of North Stormont in proportions determined by By-Law# 126 (original report), all as described in the Schedule of Assessments attached to and forming part of this By-Law as Schedule "A";
- 3. **THAT** each owner assessed \$500.00 or more will be invoiced and be given until September 30th, 2021 to pay the net cost as outlined in column of the Schedule of Assessments entitled "Net Maintenance Cost" and all assessments of \$499.99 or less will be added to the 2021 municipal taxes in one installment. Accounts of \$500.00 or more not paid by the due date shall be added to the 2022 municipal taxes with principal and interest at the rate of 1.25% per month.

BY-LAW NO. 59-2021

- THAT MacDonald Technical Services Inc., Drainage Superintendent was ordered to proceed with the maintenance of the Dunbar Campbell Adams Municipal Drain, according to the existing plan and profile of said drain.
- 2. **THAT** Council authorize write off of \$277.76 and the actual assessable cost of \$683.85 for maintenance of the Dunbar Campbell Adams Municipal Drain be assessed to the upstream lands and roads in the Township of North Stormont in proportions determined by By-Law# 36-1979 (original report), all as described in the Schedule of Assessments attached to and forming part of this By-Law as Schedule "A";
- 3. **THAT** each owner assessed \$500.00 or more will be invoiced and be given until September 30th, 2021 to pay the net cost as outlined in column of the Schedule of Assessments entitled "Net Maintenance Cost" and all assessments of \$499.99 or less will be added to the 2021 municipal taxes in one installment. Accounts of \$500.00 or more not paid by the due date shall be added to the 2022 municipal taxes with principal and interest at the rate of 1.25% per month.

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH STORMONT BY-LAW NO. 64-2021

BEING a By-Law to regulate the consumption of water from municipal waterworks.

WHEREAS Sections 8, 9 and 10 of the Municipal Act, 2001, authorize a municipality to pass by-laws that are necessary or desirable for municipal purposes and, in particular, respecting economic, social and environmental well-being of the municipality; health, well-being and safety of Persons; services and things that the municipality is authorized to provide; and protection of Persons and property, including consumer protection;

WHEREAS the Corporation of the Township of North Stormont deems it desirable to regulate water consumption during the summer months to protect the supply of water in the municipal waterworks.

NOW THEREFORE Council of the Township of the North Stormont hereby enacts as follows:

SHORT TITLE

1. This by-law may be cited as the "Water Usage By-law"

DEFINITIONS

- 2. In this by-law:
 - a. "Corporation" shall mean the Corporation of the Township of North Stormont;
 - b. "Council" shall mean the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Stormont;
 - c. "Water & Sewer Operator" shall mean the Ontario Clean Water Agency as contractor for operations of the municipal water and sewer system;
 - d. "Municipal Clerk" shall mean the Municipal Clerk of the Corporation of the Township of North Stormont.
 - e. "Municipal Law Enforcement Officer" shall mean a Municipal Enforcement Officer appointed by the Council of the Township of North Stormont;
 - f. "Township" shall mean the Township of North Stormont;
 - g. "Fire Hydrant" shall mean an upright pipe with a nozzle or spout for drawing water from a water main;

GENERAL

- 3. No person shall use, or cause to be used, water from any municipal waterworks at any time between May 1st and September 30th of any year for the purpose of watering lawns, gardens, flowers, hedges, or any other vegetation outside any building except as hereinafter provided:
 - a. Persons located at even numbered buildings shall be permitted to water lawns, gardens, flowers, hedges or any other vegetation outside on Monday, Wednesday and Friday between 7 p.m. and 10 p.m., and persons located at odd numbered buildings shall be permitted to water lawns, gardens, flowers, hedges or any other vegetation outside on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday between 7 p.m. and 10 p.m.. No outside watering will be permitted on Sundays.
 - b. Persons watering manually shall be permitted to water lawns, gardens, flowers, hedges or any other vegetation outside any building;
 - c. A contractor that needs to take water from a fire hydrant in order to perform work in the Township must contact the water operator in charge.
 - d. The operator in Charge can allow usage of specific fire hydrant or refuse water taking.
 - e. Backflow Prevention Assembly shall be required. Otherwise an air gap shall be maintained at all times.
 - f. The cost for the connection shall be \$75.00 except for work done for the Township.
 - g. The taking of water for fire hydrant shall be from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday to Friday.
 - h. The hydrant shall be opened with a hydrant wrench to prevent damage, and the valve must be fully open. Hydrant damage will be charged to contractor operating the hydrant. It is a violation when equipment in disrepair causes water waste.
 - i. Fire Hydrant shall not be operated to take water during winter, other than for the Fire Department.

GRANT OF EXEMPTION TO THIS BY-LAW

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in this By-Law,

- a. Newly installed sod: a person may send a written request for exemption of this by-law to the Municipal Clerk. If approved, newly installed sod may be exempt to the water restriction by allowing watering of sod between 7:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. for the period of 7 days.
- b. Any other request for exemption of this by-law can be sent to the Municipal Clerk in writing.

DECLERATION OF TOTAL BAN ON WATERING

5. In the event of emergency conditions, the Mayor, Chief Administrative Officer and Water and Sewer Operator, the Township may suspend any exemption as set out in section 3 and 4 of this By-Law and notice of the declaration of emergency conditions shall be sent to all affected residents by bulk mail.

ADMINISTRATION

6. The Provisions of this By-Law shall be enforced by the Municipal Law Enforcement Officer.

PENALTIES

- 7. Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law is guilty of an offence and on conviction thereof shall forfeit and pay a penalty for each such offence and every such penalty shall be recoverable under the *Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O.* 1990, c. P.33 and amendment thereto.
- 7.1 Every person is guilty of an offence who,
 - a. willfully hinders or interrupts, or causes or procures to be hindered or interrupted the corporation, or any of its officers, contractors, agents, servants or workers, in the exercise of any of the powers conferred by the Public Utilities Act;
 - b. willfully lets off or discharges water so that the water runs waste or useless out of the works;
 - c. being a tenant, occupant, or inmate of any house, building or other place supplied with water from the waterworks, improperly wastes the water or, without the consent of the corporation, lends, sells, or disposes of the water, gives it away, permits it to be taken or carried away, uses or applies it to the use or benefit of another, or to any use and benefit other than the person's own or increases the supply of water agreed for;

- d. without lawful authority willfully opens or closes any hydrant, or obstructs the free access to any hydrant, stopcock, chamber, pipe, or hydrant-chamber, by placing on it any building material, rubbish or any other obstruction;
- e. throws or deposits any injurious, noisome or offensive matter into the water or waterworks, or upon the ice, if the water is frozen, or in any ways fouls the water or commits any willful damage, or injury to the works, pipes or water, or encourages the same to be done;
- f. willfully alters any meter placed upon any service pipe or connected therewith, within or without any building or other place, so as to lessen or alter the amount of water registered; or
- g. lays or causes to be laid any pipe or main to communicate with any pipe or main of the waterworks, or in any way obtains or uses the water without the consent of the corporation, is guilty of an offence.
- 8. Any person involved in the unauthorized use of hydrant water will be charged for: the water taken, the costs incurred to investigate and correct the use, penalty fees, and other remedies authorized by law.

 Hydrant use violation set fines are \$300.00
- 9. When a person has been convicted of an offence under this By-Law, any court of competent jurisdiction thereafter, may, in addition to any other penalty imposed on the person convicted, issue an order prohibiting the continuation or repetition of the offence or the doing of any act or thing by the person convicted directed towards the continuation or repetition of the offence.
- 10. The requirements of this By-Law are severable, if any requirements of this By-Law are held invalid, the application of such requirements to other circumstances and the remainder of this by-law shall not be affected.
- 11. **THAT** this By-Law shall come into force on the date of its adoption and shall effect on that date.

"That Dead-End Road delegations be received from parents, video, site www.durhamdeadendroadkids.ca and attached correspondence and;

Whereas Dead-End Road Kids (cul-de-sacs, private roads) busing is being moved from long-time residential pick-ups; percentages of 830,000 Ontario bused students impacted as Student Transportation Services (STS) citing buses shouldn't access private roads, do 3-point turns, or backups; kids are expected to walk 1-2 km twice daily (caregivers 4x) in the morning dark or narrow road shoulders, and with no "bus stop ahead" warning signage;

Whereas parents report employment/housing is at risk as they must leave work to drop off/pick up children to avoid safety hazards of kids walking on highways unsupervised; secondary school youth reporting education at risk as missing class/affecting grades; children with disabilities are not helped (e.g. double amputee who needs bus stop moved 160 ft. and parents were told it's their "responsibility to get kids to bus safely");

Whereas parents are being told busing policy is schoolboard's, but schoolboard say its STS, who say it is the Governance Committee of Ministry of Transportation, but Ministry of Education say it's "transportation consortia who administer the policy"; and trustee, governance say cannot change policies, so parents appealing to police, press and Councils with respect to the dangers; and that an oncoming car killed 12 year old Cormac and injured his sister while waiting at a newly relocated bus stop at the base of a hill, and;

Whereas STS have advised road improvements are the responsibility of municipalities, yet municipalities do not own the needed land, nor have millions of dollars to create 77m bus turnarounds, and;

Whereas Ontario Transportation Funding is \$1 billion: Jan 27/20 Ministry said they'd improve student transportation, review funding formula; and given STS gets their funding by scoring well in reviews, and given Ministry establishing "Student Transportation Advisory Group" to hear STS sector expertise experience, and ideas;

Now Therefore Be it Resolved that the Corporation of the Municipality of Calvin requests;

- 1. Exceptions to allow 3-point turns or backing up where necessary, to provide safer service to dead-end and private road kids, that policies be amended to reflect; and when not possible,
- 2. Exceptions to allow indemnification agreements to access private land for bus turnarounds to keep bus stops safer and closer to prescribed 800m distance; and when not possible,

- 3. "Bus Stop Ahead" warning signage be required to notify oncoming traffic, prior to STS moving common stops to main roadway and,
- 4. STS be comprised of solutions like mini-buses, vans, taxis or public transit worked into funding formulas so that it does not negatively impact STS funding stats; and,
- 5. Kid Key Performance Indicator (KPI) be included for Ministry "Effectiveness & Efficiency Follow Up Reviews", establishing benchmarks for responsive problem solving for kids & parents' busing concerns, and that this be an STS factor to receive funding; and,
- 6. That the Province provide a "Parent Portal" for ongoing busing feedback of their STS, so families and kids can review/provide comments, especially during Ministry STS reviews and revisions to funding; and,
- 7. That the Province have GPS tracking software to notify parents when children picked up/dropped off, and;

That this Motion be distributed to Premier Doug Ford; Honourable Stephen Lecce, Minister of Education; Honourable Caroline Mulroney, Minister of Transportation; Honourable Vic Fedeli, MPP; Honourable Anthony Rota, MP; all Ontario Municipalities; Rural Ontario Municipal Association (ROMA); Ontario Good Roads Association (OGRA); and Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO).

Province Investigating and Updating Source Water Protection Legislation

Please be advised the Municipal Council of the Town of Fort Erie at its meeting of April 26, 2021 passed the following resolution:

Whereas the Municipal Council of the Town of Fort Erie passed a resolution on October 21st, 2019 identifying that 1,100 private water wells were in operation in the Town of Fort Erie, of which 75% were used for domestic purposes including human and livestock consumption, and

Whereas the Municipal Council of the Town of Fort Erie further identified in that resolution that Council requires the protection of water in the aquifer supplying water to those wells from contamination as the result of any remediation of Pit One owned by the Port Colborne Quarries in the City of Port Colborne, and further

Whereas Report No. PDS-23-2021, approved by Council on March 22, 2021, identified that while the Niagara Peninsula Conservation Authority, The Regional Municipality of Niagara and Local Area Municipalities work together to protect source water, these plans do not generally apply to private servicing, and

OVERVIEW

The following is a submission by Gravel Watch Ontario (GWO; water-leaved watch.org) in response to the request for feedback on the Consultation on Growing the Size of the Greenbelt ERO 019-3136. Gravel Watch Ontario is a province-wide coalition of citizen groups and individuals that acts in the interests of residents and communities to protect the health, safety, quality of life of Ontarians and the natural environment in matters that relate to aggregate resources.

Gravel Watch Ontario recognizes the obligation to protect our agricultural lands, water resources and natural environment, all of which are essential for building a climate resilient Ontario for future generations. Gravel Watch Ontario has commented on government planning and aggregate policies for over 15 years and works with our members to ensure that policies regulating gravel extraction do not result in permanent loss of farmland or rural landscape amenities and do not damage the integrity of the water resources supplied by the rural landscape.

The consultation on ways to grow the size of Ontario's Greenbelt is especially timely as the COVID 19 pandemic has highlighted the critical need for food security from local sources during crisis periods and as one of the key factors in the subsequent economic recovery. Ontario has some of the best agricultural land in Canada, much of which is not protected by current land-use planning policies. These lands are a finite, non-renewable resource, and the foundation of one of the province's largest economic sectors, agri-food. Expansion of the Greenbelt will provide permanent protection of the farmland, water sources and natural ecosystems within the proposed Plan area as well as an opportunity for Ontario to become a world leader in farmland conservation. To mitigate the impact of the leapfrogging of development and aggregate extraction beyond the four Provincial Plans, Gravel Watch Ontario believes that more restrictive development policies are required throughout the province.

Overall, Gravel Watch Ontario supports the proposed expansion of the Greenbelt as outlined in the Initial Study Area of the Paris Galt Moraine and Urban River Valleys.

Gravel Watch Ontario agrees with the province that the Paris Galt Moraine is a valuable groundwater system that must be protected. The moraines continue to be under pressure for aggregate development, water takings (including below-water-table extraction), growth as well as the impacts of a changing and variable climate.

Recently an interim licence approval was granted for aggregate extraction of 750,000 tonnes of dolostone per year (for +25 years) in an ecologically rich area of the Paris Galt Moraine in Rockwood, Ontario (Hidden Quarry). Studies have shown that the quarry will impact both municipal and private wells and a provincially significant wetland. Gravel Watch Ontario is concerned that the quarry will serve as a precedent for unlimited extension to adjacent properties and an expansion into a mega quarry site.

In determination of the boundary for the expanded Greenbelt, GWO believes that the following points must be addressed:

- That the Greenbelt boundaries be significantly expanded to include more of Ontario's agricultural land
- That below-water table aggregate extraction be prohibited in the Greenbelt (refer to Bill 71, Paris Galt Moraine Conservation Act, 2019)
- That there be broader moraine protection across the province (i.e. The Oak Ridges Moraine Conservation Act) in addition to the Greenbelt Plan
- That the Moffat Moraine (part of the Paris, Galt and Moffat Moraines ANSI) be included in the Initial Study Area and mapping
- That the Greenbelt Plan policy 4.3.2 (2) (Non-Renewable Resource Policies) which restricts municipal official plans and zoning bylaws from containing provisions that are more restrictive than the policies of the Greenbelt Plan be removed and replaced with 1.4.1 (How to Read This Plan) which states that if the plans, regulations or standards are more restrictive than this Plan, the more restrictive provision shall prevail
- That provincial policy leadership is required to analyze the extent to which the cumulative effect of aggregate extraction negatively impacts groundwater recharge in the moraine areas
- That the province assess the cumulative impacts of water taking and/or permitting in the Greenbelt Plan Study Areas and across the province
- That the outwash gravel deposits adjacent to the moraine that store and transmit groundwater recharged in the moraine to river valleys, and the river valleys that contain the high-baseflow streams fed by discharge from the moraine be included in the mapped area
- Clarification is needed as to how the identification and future protection of the designated areas relate to either the Natural Heritage System or the Agricultural System for the Greater Golden Horseshoe Growth Plan
- Clarification is needed as to how the identification and future protection of the
 water features relates to existing source water protection policies. For example,
 how does Greenbelt designation of river valleys compliment and reinforce the
 source water protection area for the Eramosa River Valley

• In keeping with the directives of the consultation proposal that stipulates the provincial government will not remove lands from the Greenbelt, we request that the government cancel plans to build Highway 413 (GTA West) and the Bradford Bypass (Holland Marsh Highway)

The above relates to the overall protection of the agricultural land base and the connectivity of the natural heritage and water resource systems that sustain ecological and human health and form the environmental framework in south-central Ontario. As requested in the consultation document, we have outlined in detail our answers to your specific questions below.

QUESTION 1

What are your thoughts on the initial focus area of the Study Area of the Paris Galt Moraine?

The Initial Focus Area of the Paris Galt Moraine indicates that the government has a clear understanding of the need to expand the Greenbelt and to protect water resource systems for future generations. Recent investigative studies show that the contributions of the moraine to groundwater recharge and discharge extend well beyond the physical land form and that they influence water flow, temperatures, quality and associated terrestrial and aquatic habitats in the water system. It has been pointed out in submissions by the City of Guelph and the Grand River Conservation Authority (GRCA) that the current mapping fails to consistently include all the glacial outwash areas next to the moraine that provide the groundwater flow linkages between the moraine features and the rivers which are sustained by moraine recharge (i.e. the Eramosa River and other streams identified by the GRCA in their submission).

Both urban development and rural land-use practices such as below-water-table aggregate extraction continue to be at risk to the integrity of the hydrologic and ecological functions of the moraine. The cumulative impacts of both aggregate extraction and water taking must be considered in relation to growth and development.

GWO recommends that a Moraine Protection Act for all moraines in the Province of Ontario be established in addition to the policies of the Greenbelt Plan. We also recommend that the mapping of the Initial Study Area include outwash areas and spillways.

GWO is concerned that the Greenbelt Plan may provide less protection from aggregate extraction than current municipal plans due to the wording of Section 4.3.2 (2) of the Plan. The Grand River Conservation Authority, the Township of North Dumfries, the City of Cambridge and the Region of Waterloo oppose any extension of the Greenbelt Legislation at this time. The Region of Waterloo requests enhanced municipal consultation prior to establishment of final mapping associated with the proposed Greenbelt expansion. They advise that unless policies (language and framework) are

revised, they oppose any extension. Their response to the Province's Consultation on Growing the Size of the Greenbelt is as follows:

"The Greenbelt Plan does not limit municipalities from adopting policies that are more stringent than the requirements of the Greenbelt Plan, except in relation to agricultural uses and mineral aggregate resources. On those topics, the policies of the Greenbelt Plan prevail and municipalities cannot adopt policies that are more stringent."

"The Regional Official Plan also prohibits aggregate extraction in Core Environmental Features. The Greenbelt Plan does not include this prohibition."

"Given that a large share of the region's groundwater recharge areas also overlap with some of the region's largest aggregate deposits, Regional staff have consistently recommended a precautionary approach when considering the extraction of mineral aggregate resources. As noted above, some of these policies are more stringent than the requirements in the Greenbelt Plan."

QUESTION 2

What are the considerations in moving from a Study Area to a more defined boundary of the Paris Galt Moraine?

We agree with the Ontario Federation of Agriculture that the province clarify how defining a boundary to bring the Paris Galt Moraine into the Greenbelt will have regard for other provincial policy directives such as emphasizing a watershed-based approach to water-resource planning and giving recognition to the moraine's role in hydrological functions.

Development of a Paris Galt Moraine Conservation Plan in addition to the Greenbelt Plan would address and protect the features and functions of a more defined Moraine Study Area. GWO recommends that these Moraine Plans be applied province-wide and that:

- they must prohibit below-water-table extraction in clear, straightforward language
- aggregate extraction is not permitted in natural core areas (as in the Oak Ridges Moraine Conservation Plan)

The province must adhere to Section 1.4.1 of the Greenbelt Plan and not have exception for mineral aggregate resources.

QUESTION 3

What are your thoughts on the initial focus area of adding, expanding and further protecting Urban River Valleys?

Both public and private lands must be included to provide protection, avoid fragmentation and act as corridors for wildlife. We do agree with the Ontario Federation of Agriculture that including the Urban River Valleys in the total Greenbelt land area should not be used in order to balance the loss of protected agricultural lands to development and aggregate extraction.

QUESTION 4

Do you have suggestions for other potential areas to grow the Greenbelt?

We believe that Ontario's Greenbelt should be expanded to include more agricultural land. In addition to the Greenbelt Plan, the moraines require a broader province wide Conservation Plan with more restrictive aggregate policies that include no below water table extraction.

Identifying 'food belts' in various regions of the province and by branding the goods produced there encourages Ontarians to grow and buy locally which will contribute to Ontario's economy and promote tourism comparable to the evolution of the Niagara Region's vineyards.

GWO supports Ontario Nature in that the following water resource areas should be protected:

- All moraines within the GGS, given their vital role in providing clean drinking water and mitigating floods;
- Private lands within urban river valleys, since it is primarily private lands, not public lands, that are threatened with urbanization and development;
- Coldwater streams, wetlands and headwaters of river systems since they
 improve water quality, provide critical habitat for fish and other wildlife and afford
 many further benefits such as flood control, carbon storage, groundwater
 recharge and recreational opportunities;
- Former glacial Lake Algonquin and Iroquois Shorelines and Plain since they feature significant groundwater discharge zones and are the headwaters of many cold water streams; and
- The Lake Simcoe Basin and Northern Simcoe County where many important ecological and hydrological features are vulnerable to land speculation and intensive development.

QUESTION 5

How should we balance or prioritize any potential Greenbelt expansion with the other provincial priorities?

As noted by the Ontario Federation of Agriculture, it is important to acknowledge that less than 5% of Ontario's land base can support any agricultural production. From 2011 to 2016, the Census of Agriculture indicated that Ontario lost 319,700 acres of Ontario farmland. That's 175 acres of farmland per day. The current system is resulting in incremental loss of agricultural lands due to the prioritization of aggregate extraction, development and growth, over farmland preservation.

Several studies have suggested that enough aggregate supply is available currently to fuel economic growth for at least 50 years. Rather than continue to prioritize the extraction of new sources of aggregate, it would be in the province's best interest to create incentives to maximize reuse and reprocessing of aggregate materials under

safe and appropriate industrial conditions. A recent study completed by The National Farmers' Union, McMaster University and Gravel Watch Ontario revealed that 77% of aggregate extraction occurs on prime agricultural lands. Given that agricultural lands are a key economic driver in Ontario, they must be protected and prioritized from invasive industrial development such as mining, pits and quarries. The Ontario Federation of Agriculture stated that the 'interim use' of aggregate extraction as considered by the aggregate industry, undermines Ontario's food sustainability and arguably permanently alters agricultural land. This finite, non-renewable resource must be permanently protected.

Aggregate extraction below the water-table results in a permanent water surface when extraction is finished. This situation results in direct exposure of the groundwater system to contamination from airborne sources and spills, as well as removes the possibility of rehabilitation of the site to resumed agricultural use. Prior to the late 1980's, Section 3.16 of the Ministry of Agriculture and Food Guidelines Policy did not permit mineral extraction on Class 1 to 3 agricultural lands unless agricultural rehabilitation of the site was carried out. Gravel Watch Ontario believes that in conjunction with growing the Greenbelt consultation, below water table aggregate extraction should be prohibited on and full rehabilitation of all extraction sites to agricultural use is necessary. More effective and extensive monitoring and transparent reporting of existing pits and quarries is required.

QUESTON 6 Are there other priorities that should be considered?

We must consider that while the Greenbelt Plan protects the countryside, it also offers green space for urban dwellers. A key consideration is the positive contribution of urban residents to rural economies through recreational uses, purchases of goods and services, visits to restaurants, farmers' markets, fairs, festivals and bed and breakfast establishments. From field to fork, the agri-food sector contributes \$47.3B to Ontario's economy and supports over 860,000 jobs.

With its general hummocky nature, sand and gravel deposits and permeable soils, the Paris Galt Moraine provides and purifies water at no cost to citizens. Establishing a Moraine Conservation Act is an opportunity to address water management concerns in a fiscally responsible manner now before the situation becomes dire. Failing to properly protect the moraine and in turn preserve the region's source of fresh water will lead to massive investments for infrastructure to provide water for the region. Furthermore, local business, farmers and industry depend upon this water source for local jobs and prosperity.

CONCLUSION

Gravel Watch Ontario is optimistic that the outcome of this consultation process will lead to the permanent protection of the Paris-Galt Moraine. It is essential at this time that the province moves forward with the permanent protection of Ontario's agricultural lands, natural heritage and water resources through both the Greenbelt Plan and a Moraine Conservation Act with more restrictive aggregate policies. Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the proposed Greenbelt expansion in the Initial Study Area. Gravel Watch Ontario looks forward to continuing to work with the province during the next stages of this consultation and we welcome any questions you may have.

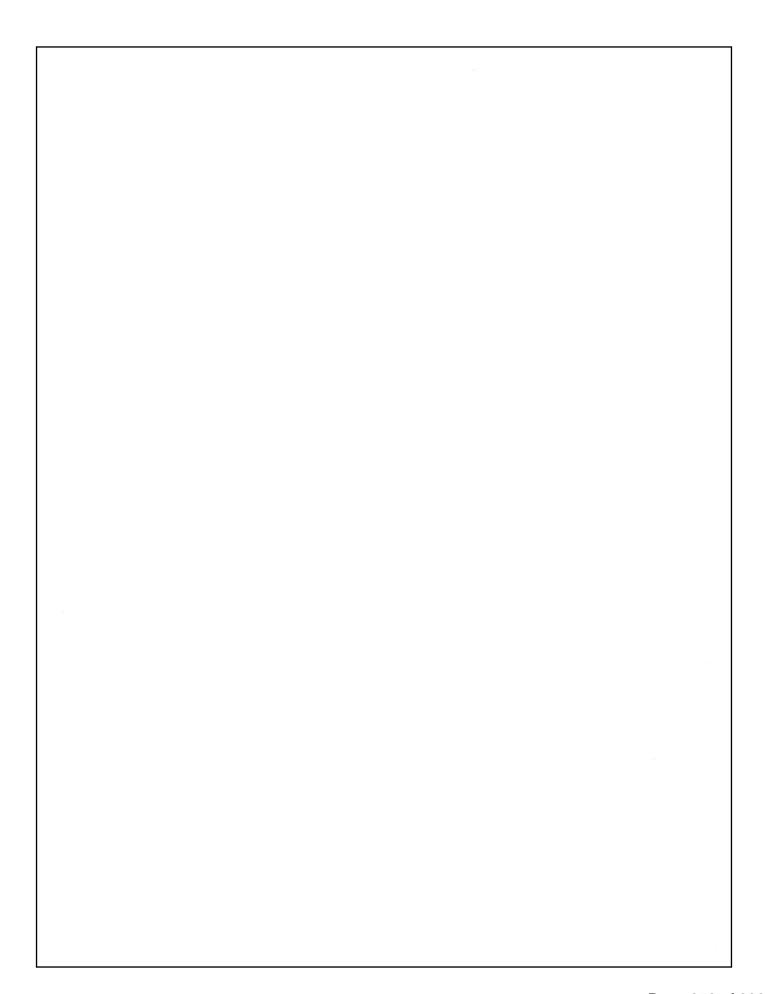

Our agricultural advisory board (AAB) who represents the agricultural sector in Norfolk County, Ontario is very concerned about the federal government's current carbon pricing policies. It is our hope that you consider our concerns and move to exempt all primary agriculture producers from current and future carbon taxes.

Carbon tax remains as a major cost of production for producers in Norfolk County. Although some farm fuel purchases are exempt, it is selective and does not meet the needs of the entire agriculture industry. Currently crop drying, heating/cooling of livestock barns and cooling of perishable commodities are still subject to full carbon taxes.

Currently there are no replacements for fossil fuels in agricultural production. As a result, carbon tax policies are notappropriate for the agricultural sector and only decrease farm margins.

Norfolk County which is known as Ontario's garden is home to one of the country's largest diversity of crop production. In addition to the extensive vegetable, fruit and grain production it boasts some of the highest ecological diverse natural habitats, plants and animals in Canada. There is approximately 25% tree cover in the county which is the highest percentage of forested land in Southwestern Ontario. Norfolk County It is also home to over 10,000 acres of woodlots and wetlands protected under Long Point Conservation Authority. In addition to the natural woodlots and wetlands there is also extensive fruit production with 2000 acres of apples and 1000 acres of sour cherries. A mature orchard can fix upwards of 18 mt of C02 annually.

The adoption of production practices to protect the soil and environment are advanced in Norfolk County. There has been a wide implementation of cover cropping, planting green and reduced tillage practices all of which sequester carbon. Additional farming practices of 4R nutrient management coupled with precision technology ensure that appropriate nutrients are applied at the right time, place and rate. In many cases sensitive water sources around ponds and wetlands are planted with buffer strips and soil erosion control measures of grassed waterways and windbreaks are also common practices. ALUS (alternative land use) programs have been embraced across the county, taking unproductive land out of production, and returning it to natural native grass plantings, trees and constructed wetlands. Currently there are 1148 active projects with 189 producers covering 1573 acres in Norfolk County managed under the ALUS program.

The agriculture industry has made great strides to protect the environment and will continue to improve production practices that reduces the carbon footprint in food production.

The AAB board believes that all on farm fuels used in agricultural production should be exempt from carbon tax. This should include natural gas, propane, gas, and diesel. We strongly urge the government to be consistent with a sector wide exemption to current carbon tax policies.

I am writing to you today to convey the concerns of the Council of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry regarding your government's plans for implementing permanent remote learning after the COVID-19 pandemic.

At the County Council meeting of May 17, 2021, Council received a delegation from the Upper Canada District School Board (UCSDB), who expressed their concerns regarding proposed legislation that would make online education a permanent part of the publicly funded school system.

Our Council shares the concerns of the UCDSB and feels that these proposed changes to make remote learning permanent within the education system has not accounted for the impact on small, rural, and remote schools operated by local school boards. There has also been a complete lack of any wide-spread consultation with local school boards, municipalities, and communities on this matter.

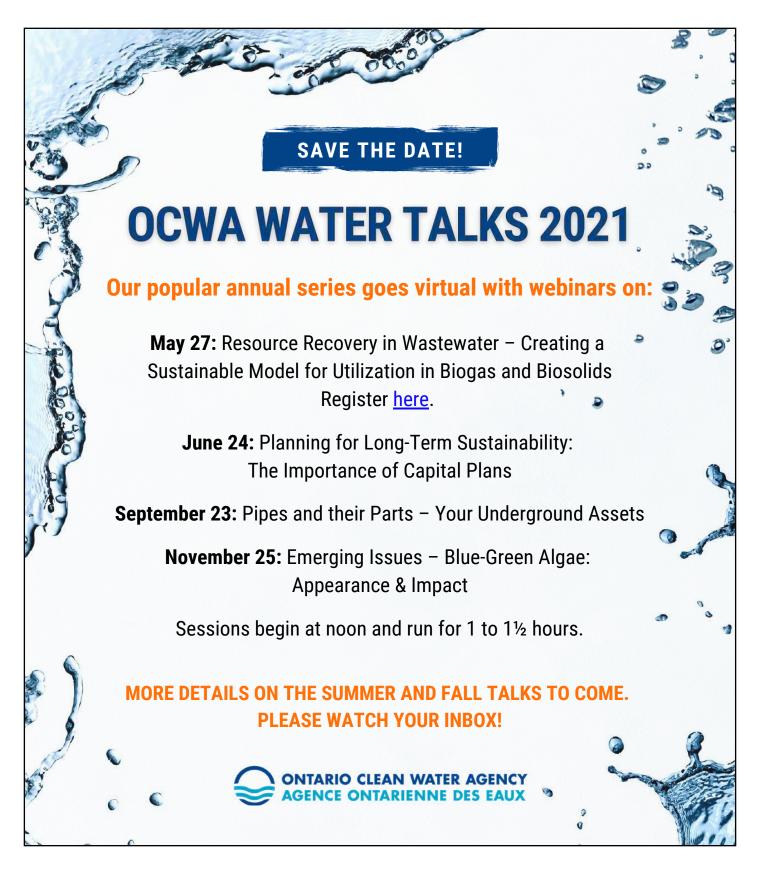

That the Mayor and the appropriate officers of the Township of North Stormont are hereby authorized and directed to do all things necessary to give effect to the actions of the Council of the Township of North Stormont, to obtain approvals where required and except as otherwise provided, the Mayor and Clerk are hereby directed to execute all documents necessary on behalf of the Corporation of the Township of North Stormont and to affix the corporate seal.
